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This winery is situated in Ceglo (Zegla), a small village in the region of Goriska Brda, by the Slovene-Italian border, by the Italian hills of Collio. Half of the vineyards lie in Slovenia and half in Italy. The winery was started in 1860 by Anton Simcic who bought a farm in Medana and began winegrowing and winemaking. In 1988, his son Marijan took over and remodeled the winery by building a new and modern wine cellar which created the perfect condition for producing high quality wines.

Grape Varieties:	100% Pinot Grigio
Location of Vineyards:	Collio, Italy and Brda, Slovenia
Vineyards:	Zegla, Rusic and Plešivo vineyards. Marl, Slate and sandstone soil.
Vinification:	Maceration for 12 hours followed by fermentation in stainless steel tanks at controlled temperatures for 8 months.
Production:	13,333 bottles in June 2008
Average age of vines:	8-25 years
Winemaker:	Marijan Simcic
Tasting Notes:	Yellow with a rosy and light golden tint. Intense and complex aroma. A flowery bouquet develops over time into fruit and spice. On the palate, a soft, mature and fruity initial bouquet takes on a hint of apricot and melon with a bit of bitterness at the end. Very enchanting with soft texture and characteristics of its sort.



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
